Coursework Timeline

- Competitive applicants will have the Required Coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Spring coursework will not be considered for summer/fall applicants.

Additional Information

- Plan early. Transfer applicants are strongly encouraged to connect with a Texas A&M University admissions counselor as soon as an interest in Texas A&M University is identified.
- · Mays admits 100 transfer students each year.
- Transfer students are admitted for summer or fall semesters only. **No spring admissions**. Mays admits its complete transfer admission class in the original review of applications; as such, spring grades are not considered.
- Applicants need a grade of "A" in most courses to be competitive. Courses in progress at the time of application are considered incomplete.
- Personal Statement: Applicants are encouraged to use the required essay as an opportunity to identify their past accomplishments, discuss what they
 hope to study at Texas A&M University, and describe how their undergraduate business education will help them meet goals after graduation. The
 most effective transfer admission essays detail the applicant's academic and career goals. Application essays are read and reviewed for content,
 presentation and style.
- Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.
- Preference is given to applicants ready to join Mays' junior class upon arrival at Texas A&M.
- Although Mays does not state a specific number of Maximum Transferable Hours, acceptance of transfer credit for business courses will generally be
 limited to those courses taught in the freshman and sophomore years at Texas A&M University. Mays undergraduate students must take all
 300- and 400- level business coursework in residence at Texas A&M University.
- Mays' undergraduate program is subject to strict enrollment management. Although no minimum GPA is required, the competitive nature of transfer admission to Mays results in denial of many highly qualified applicants. IMPORTANT: Transfer applicants are instructed NOT to accept transfer admission to a non-business major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.

Transfer Course Sheet Notes

- 1. Admission preference is given to applicants with the highest GPA and the most appropriate courses completed.
- 2. Transfer applicants are encouraged to complete <u>University Core Curriculum</u> coursework found in the <u>Undergraduate Catalog</u> unless specified above.
- 3. This Transfer Course Sheet was supported in a partnership between the Office of Admissions and Mays Business School at Texas A&M University with the Undergraduate Catalog having the most extant and definitive information.
